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Understanding STAAR and How to Access Your Student's Results

Understanding how your child is doing is critical to being able to support their success. Each year, the state education agency, TEA, administers the State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness (STAAR) to students in grades 3-8 to give parents, schools, districts, and community stakeholders a clear understanding of how their child is progressing in relation to grade level subject standards. These tests are based on the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS), which are the standards that school systems and teachers use to plan what students are taught each day in their classrooms and show whether a student understands a core subject at a certain grade level. Your child's performance on the exam can help to inform you if your child is prepared to enter the next grade level. Each student's performance on a STAAR subject test falls into one of four performance levels:

1. **Masters Grade Level:** *This means your child showed a strong understanding of the course content and is likely to succeed in the next grade level in this subject.*
2. **Meets Grade Level:** *This means your child showed an understanding of the material and is on grade level. While there is room for improvement, your child is likely to succeed in the next grade level without much help in this subject.*
3. **Approaches Grade Level:** *This means your child showed some understanding of the material, but it is likely that your child will need extra help in this subject to be successful in the next grade level in this subject.*
4. **Did Not Meet Grade Level:** *This means your child did not show enough understanding of the material and did not meet grade-level learning goals. Your child will need significant support in this subject to be successful in the next grade level.*



You can access your child's STAAR results by visiting www.texasassessment.gov and logging into the TEA Family Portal. You will need your child's unique student access code, date of birth, and legal first name. If you do not know your child's access code, you can reach out to your child's school or district.

STAAR is regularly analyzed to ensure it is valid, reliable, aligned, and readable at grade level. If you have questions about your child's performance, we encourage you to reach out to your child's school to learn more about how you can support your child and their learning and get regular updates on their academic progress.
